Hurricane Season

Well it's that time of year again – Hurricane Season. By now, thanks to Irma and Matthew, we are all too familiar with the multitude of things that can wreak havoc on our boats. Fortunately, there are many resources available to aid us in developing a preparation plan whether our boat will be trailered, stored "on the hard", lift kept, docked, or anchored.

Here we will review some of the most obvious things we can do to make our boats as secure as possible. Many of these are "common sense" but bear being stated nonetheless. In closing, there will be a list of links to the resources used as references in writing this article. You may wish to visit these for additional information and some scary photos of what can happen.

ALL BOATS

If it's removable, **remove it**. This includes any cushions, canvas, eisenglass, biminis, electronics, PFD's, etc. If they aren't on the boat they won't get damaged. Fold and secure any frames that must remain in place. This gives the added benefit of reducing windage which will reduce risk of damage however the boat is stored. After removing all removable electronics, tightly seal those that cannot be removed. If the boat will not be in the water, disconnect all batteries and electrical connections.

TRAILERED

If you will be leaving your boat on its trailer, it goes without saying that you should park it in as high and sheltered a location as possible. Also be aware of things that may fall on it (tree limbs, power lines, etc.) during the storm and minimize these. Secure your boat to its trailer using straps, lines, or both and, if possible, secure the trailer to the ground as well. At a minimum, block and/or deflate the tires. Make sure the boat is fully covered and the cover is secured with wrap-around ties/straps, not just snaps. Remove the drain plug(s) and disconnect the battery.

ON THE HARD



Some of our boats are kept in yards on jacks. Make sure the stands are on pavement or pads to prevent their sinking. Lines should be used to anchor the boat against wind shifting and stand collapse. Do not use lines with stretch.

LIFT KEPT

This is one of the least desirable options yet, for some of us (including me), the only one available. If you must leave your boat on a lift you will need to make several decisions: how can I minimize the amount of water (weight) that gets/stays in the boat (simply pulling the plug may result in sinking if the surge exceeds lift travel); will the lift rise enough with a storm surge so I can secure the boat tightly or must I allow for float without risking settling incorrectly when the surge ebbs. What happens when the power fails?

DOCKED



The best option for docking is a floating dock with very tall pilings. Beware of storm surge that exceeds piling height as the whole dock may become a raft. Should short pilings be a concern, move to another dock. If at a fixed dock, use cleats and pilings that will allow for the longest lines possible. In all instances it is best to use double

lines and fenders with chafe guards (fire hose) as at least one line will fail.

ANCHORED

Unless caught traveling, it is doubtful any of our members will be at anchor or moored in a hurricane. However, should it happen, go with at least double everything: two or more anchors, extra rode, double lines to mooring balls, etc. If time permits, try to find the most sheltered area available.
