No education article this month — just a few interesting facts about boats/ships:

• Ships have a finite lifespan. Most ocean-going cargo ships have a lifespan of 20 to 30 years, but a plywood or fiberglass sailboat has 30 to 40 years. Ships constructed of solid wood can survive considerably longer, but they must be maintained regularly. If properly maintained, a steel-hulled ship can survive over 100 years.

- Because freshwater lakes are less corrosive than seawater lakes, freshwater ships endure longer. With proper handling, a regular fiberglass boat can last for 10-25 years. A well-maintained boat can even last for more than 50 years.
- Only 40 individuals were on board the first ship to reach America, including Christopher Columbus. It was about the size of a bus and didn't surpass 70 feet in length.
- ♦ Boats were utilized about 900,000 years ago, according to evidence discovered by numerous archaeologists.
- Approximately 18 million boats are owned by Americans today. Others are business boats, while others are utilized for leisure purposes.
- The "Seawise Giant," an oil tanker constructed in 1979 and decommissioned in 2009, was the world's longest self-propelled ship in history. It was a supertanker built in 1974–1979 by Sumitomo Heavy Industries in Yokosuka, Kanagawa, Japan. It had 46 tanks and 339,5000 sq. ft of deck space. She possessed the greatest deadweight tonnage ever recorded. When Seawise Giant was fully loaded, her 81 foot draft was too deep for the ship to safely navigate the relatively shallow waters of the English Channel. The rudder weighed 230 tons, and the propeller weighed 50 tons.














FBYC Ship Store
